P-R-O-C-E-E-D-I-N-G-S

MS. KAREN LAWFER: So we will open this public meeting. This evening we are taking testimony on the Certificate of Need application submitted by Providence Alaska Medical Center for emergency power supply system.

We are in the public comment period for the Certificate of Need application. And all public comments need to be received in my office by 4:30

June 28th. I have copies of the public notice available here if you would like to take one with you if you know of somebody that would like to submit a public comment. Otherwise, it is available on-line, as well. The application is available on-line for people to look at it.

And with that, I also want to let everybody that is here know that once you have provided your thoughts and your testimony regarding this CON application, it is perfectly acceptable for you to leave. I will not take it as a personal affront.

And we will be here till 6:30, but you are more than welcome to leave.

And with that, I would like to introduce
Robert Honeycutt with Providence Alaska Medical
Center.

MR. ROBERT HONEYCUTT: Thank you. My name is Robert Honeycutt. I'm the Chief Operating Officer for Providence Alaska Medical Center, and we are seeking approval to build an emergency generator building and replacement switchgear for our current system.

Our current system is between 24 and 36 years old, and instead of just a simple one-to-one replacement, we are also looking at increasing our capacity over our current system we have, to increase our functionality and the length of time that we can run the system. This is in answer to the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Health Care Organizations Sentinel Event Alert, Issue 37, which was dated September 6, 2006.

What we are proposing is to increase our capacity from the current 3.2 megawatts to four megawatts, as well as provide an additional generator, two-megawatt backup generator. That's so that if one of the primary generators goes down, it will kick in and still we will be able to provide the four megawatts of power.

In addition to that, we are looking to triple our fuel storage from our current capacity of 30,000 gallons to 90,000 gallons. This will allow

us to operate the system the 96 hours that the Joint Commission is recommending we be able to do.

In order to do this, what we are looking to build is a 19,278-square-foot building that will be located adjacent to our existing facilities building and will house the generators and the switchgear. The reason we are having to build a separate building instead of just replace the generators where they are currently located is, number one, the new equipment is larger, takes up more space than what we have.

And two, we are required to continually provide the emergency generator capabilities to the campus so, therefore, we can't take out what we have now and replace it because during that we would be down and not be able to provide the required emergency power generation. So this is forcing us to build a separate building, put all the equipment in it, run it up and make sure it's operational, hook it into the hospital, and then we can remove the old equipment. That way we will continuously have the emergency generator power capability.

And third, we are building the building large enough so that in the future, as Providence grows, we will be able to add additional generator

sets to provide emergency power generation to the new buildings.

And it's important to note that this building and generators will provide power only to the campus, Providence Alaska Medical Center campus. It will not provide power to the attached and associated medical office buildings.

The decision to do this, aside from the fact that the current equipment is old and is needing replacement is, as I mentioned earlier, the requirement of the Joint Commission that states that a hospital must be able to operate for 96 hours in the event of an emergent or disastrous event when electrical power is unavailable from external sources; in other words, the utility power coming in from ML&P.

What it doesn't do is define the level of operations, leaving the hospital some flexibility to respond to the immediate and predicted patient care needs of the community. By having these generator sets, as well as the expanded capacity of our fuel storage, we will be able to meet this new requirement.

And as the largest health care provider and the only tertiary care provider facility in Alaska,

we must have this project in order to both have an adequate and reliable supply of electrical power in the event of a natural disaster or anything else that interrupts utility power to the hospital, as well as appropriately size it to provide and sustain

this power over the required amount of time.

We will very carefully phase in this power. As I mentioned, we have to continually provide emergency power generation capability during the construction, and then as we build it and phase it in, we will take the old equipment out and then we will be completely on the new equipment.

The total cost associated with this is \$36,102,750. Construction will be final no later than March of 2013. And that's it. Any questions?

MS. KAREN LAWFER: All right. Thank you. Is there anyone else who would like to speak as -- in regard to the Certificate of Need?

MR. DONALD LONG: No.

MS. JANE GRIFFITH: No.

MS. KAREN LAWFER: With that, we will go off the record. And now you can talk amongst yourselves.

(Off the record.)
